### --FACCC Think Tank Report

Sarah Thompson

Need bylaws change and some wordsmithing; back in November for second read.

Audit request to JLAC of unrestricted reserves at several districts. District reserves affect working conditions and solvency of institutions. There is very little standardization and often conflicting information from districts. COOOO doesn't help. Recommended values are not adequately scalable from large to small colleges.
