A & P Conference - Brainstorming

- Something that would bring in key leaders of color across the state
 - Thought leaders thinking about anti-racist work
 - What work can your institution do?
 - New chancellor at Peralta Tammeil G., extraordinary

- Thinking about our project in terms of trying to move the needle on what are committees doing on anti-racist work, help committees not working on it on how to do it
 - encouraging, inspiring, and with tools to move the needle on it
 - Can we get the whole A&P conference theme to be anti-racisim?
 - Overarching things, whether individual or by committee and how will they approach it?
 - The planning committee for the A & P conference
 - Get someone from our committee onto that
 - Feb 24 Advocacy and Policy Conference
- Could be a compliment to the Emancipation Award work
 - Cool anti-racist work is being done in prisons and community colleges
 - Laney College's Roger Chung- Restoring Our Communities nicky to follow up
 - See a whole conference with anti-racism being the main thread throughout
- To what extent is there embedded racism within the organization? Some BIPOC people feeling excluded from sometimes cliquish nature of FACCC
- Get 2 or 3 people to meet between now and the next meeting to meet and flex out the possibilities to what we have here
 - Bring it back to the meeting in October to discuss and choose
 - Nicky, Natalina, and Rocio will work on putting together BIPOC ideas for the A & P Conference prior to the October meeting

• Emancipation Award

• Jim and Robin

- Nicky suggests both a Faculty Award and a Student Award
- Bringing formerly incarcerated students to the college
- \circ $\,$ This award is for faculty members going into the prisons
- Q: When we look at the scope of the work, people who are incarcerated or formerly incarcerated, we are seeing that the entire stream of work being done is also creating continuity such that there is a pathway to a more fruitful life?
- As we look at this award as a committee, how do people think about the scope
- Rising Scholars program
 - Working with justice-impacted students
 - Rising scholars network share information, best practices
 - Most folks who work in the programs are mainly staff, capture the body of this work better for students
 - Recognize staff the common thread. Student stories are amazing

- How best to highlight mass incarceration and the issues around it, as well as solutions
- Many students come out and want to do justice work
- A lot of faculty coming to the conference can get behind it
- The last awardee Jasmine Williams, it was only done once, the last conference(the one before last - 2024)
- The committee didn't do it last year, or it was dropped and the committee not consulted?
- Nicky proposes we also include a student and find a way to get money attached, \$500 or \$1,000
 - Go to the board first then think about raising money
 - Students who has been part of a rising scholar program, a faculty and a student thing
 - How to get the Rising Scholars network to nominate folks
 - Easy lift to do
 - We voted on this we voted to add a student component to the award pending FACCC Board approval if needed
- Faculty award, who has impacted? Should it be an award for a faculty member who has positively impacted incarcerated or formerly incarcerated students or solely dedicated to a faculty member teaching within the prison system?
 - Originally designed to be the latter?
 - If there is a significant number of folks who teach within the systems, then pick from there. If there are not enough there, then we can expand it to scholars who teach with justice impacted students?
 - For both prison and jail systems- Jail is a year or less (misdemeanors);
 prison is a year or more (felonies)
 - Come back with more research for next meeting.
 - Robin has done research prior
 - How many people are teaching within the college and jails
 - Jim will do a little research
 - Robin, how many faculty in jails? How many classes?
- Deeper discussion
 - Re-Agendize Phil Hu
 - Boot committee recruitment- recruit folks
